Mental health crisis (psychosis, suicidal or homicidal ideation), abuse in the home, homelessness

- Mental health and addiction services for uninsured and those on Medicaid/Medicare
- Professional referral not required for patients with mental health concerns regarding ongoing psychiatric care or those seeking addiction treatment

Investigation of sex crimes against children and adults, physical child abuse, runaways, missing children, felony domestic violence, elder abuse/vulnerable adult abuse, and registration violations of sex offenders.

MobileMed – Primary Care + Behavioral Health – 301-493-2400

Primary care and counseling for life stressors, depression, anxiety, trauma, or other concerns that do not require ongoing psychiatric care. Available for the uninsured and those on Medicaid. Referrals to other resources for addictions and more significant mental health concerns.

MobileMed and its Partners are supported by a City of Gaithersburg Grant to provide:

Mental health assessments, including:

1. Individual and family group counseling
2. Coordination of medication management
3. Provision/referral of psychiatric professional services as needed

Sheppard Pratt (formerly Family Services, Inc.) Outpatient Mental Health Center – 301-840-3200

Treatment for a variety of mental health conditions. Specializing in mood, anxiety and thought disorders. Currently accepting Medicaid and offering telehealth appointments.
